#### ecomaine covID-19 Contractor and Vendor Requirements

Directions: This form is to be filled out *prior to your start of work or visit* at ecomaine. If you should leave the job to go to another job site and then return to ecomaine, you will need to fill out a new COVID-19 form attesting to your most current health status.

This unprecedented request is the result of evolving medical information concerning the transmissibility of the COVID-19 virus. This affirmation applies to every worker or visitor who comes onsite to any ecomaine facility: Recycling, Waste-to-Energy Plant and Landfill.

ecomaine requires all workers and visitors coming on-site to have a direct ecomaine contact person to whom you will report. That contact person is responsible for ensuring a COVID-19 health attestation form is filled out and returned back to the Health and Safety Management Team. Part I presents a list of required questions regarding your health status while Part II presents a list of hygiene and social distancing recommendations from the federal and Maine Centers for Disease Control (CDC).


