

# Reporting

- 2023 Waste Generation and Capacity Report 38 M.R.S. § 2124-A:
  - ➤ Waste generated: 2020 and 2021 = ~1.4M tons
  - ➤ Maine's recycling rate 2020 and 2021 ~34%
  - ➤ MSW Disposal: Landfills ~56% / WTE ~44%
    - 9 operating landfills accepting MSW
    - 3 operating WTE facilities
    - 31 small municipal or generator landfills
  - ➤ Unknowns
    - MRC facility in Hampden
    - JRL expansion, Hatch Hill vertical increase
    - Sludge waste stream
    - Regional capacity issues





# Reporting

 2023 Annual Product Stewardship Report – 38 M.R.S. § 1772(1):

**Beverage containers** 

**Certain consumer batteries** 

**Cell phones** 

Mercury containing: thermostats, auto switches, and lamps (light-bulbs)

Latex and oil-based architectural paint

E-waste including video displays (TVs, monitors, laptops, tablets, etc.) gaming devices, and printers



## **Program Updates**

#### Stewardship Program for Packaging (38 M.R.S. §2146)

- > Several stakeholder meetings underway since December 2022
- > Tomorrow May 9th next stakeholder meeting!

Rules to BEP (End of 2023)

Rulemaking (2023-2025)

Rulemaking (SO) selected (2026)

Stewardship Organization (SO) selected (2026)

Rulemaking Organization (SO) selected (2026)

#### Drug take-back Stewardship Program (38 M.R.S. §1612)

- > Two SO's selected and plans approved by DEP:
  - ➤ Inmar and Med-Project
- Program up and running mid-late June
- Some rulemaking may be required



# **Program Updates**

#### Solid Waste Diversion Program (38 M.R.S. §2201-B)

- Compost school and waste diversion workshops in 2023
- Waste diversion grants Round 1 awarded \$139,364 5 recipients! Anticipate total of \$250,000 for 2023
- AmeriCorps member Dominique Dispirito
  - ➤ Community coordination several communities
  - ➤ Waste diversion listserv 168 members
  - ➤ GIS and mapping

### Post Consumer Recycled Content Program (38 M.R.S. §1615)

- Manufacturers to report % of recycled content in plastic beverage containers in 2024
  - Post consumer recycled content: 25% by 2026; 30% by 2031
- Rulemaking will be required; New staff to be hired after July 1



# **Legislative Updates - 2023**

#### THERE ARE SO MANY BILLS !!!!!

- Topics run the gamut related to: bans, recycling, waste hierarchy, waste capacity, organics management, reporting requirements, beverage containers, and more
- MM legislation not yet signed into law from 131<sup>st</sup>
- Review of some of the laws that have passed out of ENR but have not yet hit the floor
- Review of some other laws tabled
- Review of bills still being heard
- ...And more still coming!





# Sludge and PFAS Updates

#### **Background**

- 130<sup>th</sup> Legislature/2022 LD 1911, LD 1639
- Late February/Early March 2023: JRL no more sludge
- March 8, 2023 legislative briefing
- Actions by DEP: Temp sludge transfer; Regional communications;
   Stakeholder engagement

#### **Moving forward:**

- Stabilized but everyone uneasy more solutions needed!
- Actions by DEP: Continued stakeholder engagement; MEWEA and DEP joint study; ID range of options/solutions and costs
- Full update and potential proposal for funding investments to legislature planned for 2024
- Several stakeholders independently looking for solutions



## What's Next

#### This spring/summer:

- Fed SWIFR \$ coming > \$500K! Statewide waste characterization and MMMP development
- Other Federal funding may become available
- June
  - > 5-9th Maine Compost School
  - > RFP for Round 2 WD grants to go out anticipate ~\$125,000
  - Pharma take-back program begins!
- Waste diversion workshops
- Continued stakeholder meetings: EPR Packaging Rules; Sludge
- Launch post consumer recycled content beverage program
